He married ANTJE JANSEN Abt. 1770 in New Paltz, Ulster Co., NY, daughter of HANNES JANSEN and NENNIE -2. She was born Abt. 1755 in NY State, and died Aft. 1830 in (bef 1832 as she is not listed in Josiah's Will) New Paltz, Ulster Co., NY>>online>> (Theresa Gaskell>) D. 1830 in NEW PALTZ, ULSTER COUNTY, NEW YORK..

Notes for JOSIAH DRAKE:

In the first US Federal Census:

1790 Census we find Josiah living in New Paltz, NY age 40 years living with 4 women, 4 boys (they did have 4 sons and 3 daughters).

In 1810 Josiah (60 yrs) is in Ulster Co., Gilbert Drake, his son, lives on the next farm and next to Gilbert is another son, John.

In 1820 Census, Josiah Drake is 69-70, has a boy under 10 yrs; 1 - 16-25 yrs; 1 girl under 10; and a girl 16-25 yrs; his wife is over 45.

In the 1830 census, he's about 80 and his wife 70-80. It's believed Isaac and family lived in the house and farmed his father's land.

References to Josiah is mentioned on pg R11, on pg 38 and on page R25:

On pg 38 it states: "Josiah Drake had a forty acre rental in the region of the Squire James Brown farm at Pratts Mills in 1775. It was west of the lands now owned by Henry Erichsen and in "the north half of Lot #1" but the various notched trees that formed its corner boundaries have disappeared."

On pg R11 "Josiah Drake, originally from Marlborough" is listed under the Title "The Men"

On pg R26 is says "The last pay for the company did not come through until 1786. (Among those listed on pg R27 is:) Josiah Drake

William Drake is mentioned on page 131: "Up on the Peat Swamp Road a William Drake lived on the

Amasa Martin place in 1805....."

and a Gilbert: page 130: (after seeing the pages, I am not so sure this is our Gilbert as Hope had believed 4/19/2002)

"Later Gilbert Drake, the elder and Johnathan Tomkins arrived".

Josiah and his family attended and helped form the Low Dutch Church in New Paltz, the info is below.

Josiah fought in the Revolutionary War.

Pension Paper # S10587 His pension report reads as follows:

1. In the first week of the month of August 1776, at New Paltz, New York, Ulster County, he volunteered to serve for the term of 5 months, in a company commanded by Captain Jacob Hasbrouck and Abraham Deyo, a first lieutenant therein. He marched to the Hudson River and went on board a sloop laying near Poughkeepsie on board of which --- sloop he with the residue of said Company were transported to Fort Montgomery in County of Orange and from there to

Groton River in the County of Westchester from whence they marched by land to Kingsbridge, where they were engaged in keeping quarters and erecting Fort Independence. Near the latter part of said term, said Company marched from Kingsbridge to Fort Constitution, where they lay until the expiration of said term, which was the 1st of January 1777 when he with said company was honourably discharged having served the said term of 5 months. Colonel Levi Palding commanded the Regiment to which said Company belonged and General Clinton, the Brigade.--- --Logan was Adjutant-- At Kingsbridge, he recollects seeing General Washington, his army lay there and at White Plains.-- He also recollects seeing Capt. Moses Contine, Capt. Kortright and Capt. Swarthout.-- He further says that John Eckert and Abraham Palmantier of New Paltz served with him during said term of 5 months.

2. On or about the 15th day of May 1777 he was drafted to serve one month in guarding the Indian frontier in the County of Ulster, which month he served under Capt. John Schoonmaker, in Col. Cantures Regiment and was stationed at John Brodhead's at Lurenkill in the County of Ulster.

3. In the month of October 1777 when Fort Montgomery was taken by the British and they were ascending the Hudson River, he belonged to Capt. Ransom's Company of Militia at New Paltz and was out in actual service guarding the shores of said River for 8 days--at the expiration of 8 days, said company marched from Kingston to Albany and thence to Stillwater in the County of Saratoga and continued there in actual service until after Burgoyne's Army had surrendered-- said Company then took charge of 4 or 5 hundred British soldiers who were prisoners and brought them to Albany where they were delivered to the keeper of the Fort. From thence, said company returned home and he served at this time 3 weeks. Nathaniel Potter was lieutenant in said company and Col. Cantine commanded the regiment. He recollects Gen'l. Gates who commanded the American Army.

4. In the months of June, August and October in the year 1778 he was drafted from his class to serve one month at each of these several times and actually served 3 months within said time in all 3 months--in guarding the Indian frontiers in the County of Ulster. The 1st month he was stationed at Shocan in said County and served under Capt. Frederich Schoonmaker. --The second month he lay at Wawassing in said county and served under Capt. Abraham Deyo-- the third month he lay at Shandaken in said county and served unter Lt. Nathaniel Potter--Col. Cantine commanded the troops on said frontier.--he further says that in all of the above several services, Abraham Palmatier of said town of New Paltz was with him and does not know of any other person who can testify to his service excepting to the 1st above mentioned service of 5 months. He has no documentary evidence of said services.

In answer to the investigators' required to be put to applicants for a pension, he says

1. He was born at Fishkill in the County of Dutchess, state of New York on the 1st day of July 1750 old stile.

2. He has a record of his age now in his possession.

3. He lived at the said town of New Paltz when called into the above services and he is resided there ever since the Revolutionary War and now resides in New Paltz.

4. He entered into the 1st above mentioned service as a volunteer--at the other times he entered into the above mentioned services as a drafted man.

5. He cannot recollect at this time any other officer, Circumstances than as above set forth, except Col. Soper.

6. He always received a verbal discharge at the expiration of the several terms of service above mentioned.

7. He is known to ___ Lake Esq--recently one of the Senators of this state and now one of the judges of the said County of Ulster residing near him in said town of New Paltz, also to Doctor Barnabus Newton who also resides near to him, both of who can certify to his charactor and their belief of his service.

And he further says that by reason of old age and a lingering disorder upon him he is unable to attend any Court of record in the said County, of Ulster, neither has he been able to attend any such court within 10 years last past and never expects to be well enough to attend any such

court not having been out to his nearest neighbors for 2 years last past--said courts are held at Kingston in said County of Ulster about 20 miles from the place of his residence.

In the Name of God, I Josiah Drake of the Town of New Paltz County of Ulster am in a weak state of health. But in a sound mind and memory. Do make this last will and Testament that is to pay to give my Children my Lands and Tenaments and removables unto my Children Who I shall herein name that is to say unto William Drake One Equal part of all my lands and Movables and unto the rest of my Children Who I shall name herin John Drake, Elizabeth Devoe the wife of Jacob Devoe, Gilbert Drake, Catherine Bush the wife of Jacob Bush, Sarah Palmatier the wife of Jacob Palmatier, Isaac Drake, the Chidlren who I have herein name to go equal share and share alike in the Lands and tenaments before named that is to an equal seventh part unto each of them. But unto Sarah my daughter I make this reserve I give it to her and Children forever that no other person to have any thing to say herein or to have any profit thereby Amen.--

Now I do appoint Jacob Bush, John Drake, Isaac Drake, my sole executors to sell and dispose of the Lands here in mentioned and other loose preferly and not be in too great hurry for sale I give this as counsel as to this My Last Will

I have here unto set my hand and seal in the Year of Lord One thousand, Eight hundred and thirty two the 17th day of April

Josiah's Will Petition for probate:

This is from records in the Ulster Co. Surrogate's Office, Kingston, NY:

Will of Josiah Drake, pr. 6-27-1833. Petition dated 6-24-1833, gives his death date as 5-20-

1833, will dated 4-17-1832. Petitioners were Isaac Drake, Jacob Bush and John Drake, executors of the will. Next of kin listed in the petition were:

Gilbert Drake of Steuben Co., NY;
Elizabeth, wife of Jacob DeVoe of Steuben Co; (They are later found in Michigan)

The above information was received via Hope Hatch from the Haviland-Heidgerd Historical Collection, Elting Memorial Library New Paltz, NY---Irene H. Martin, Director also town Historian. (Nov 19, 1986)

She has a copy of the will, but because of the age it is very difficult to read. (Jan 2000: Hope sent me a copy of this will, It is very hard to read almost impossible in places. But you can read DeVoe instead of Deyo)

In May of 2000 Dan Stifflear a researcher for the Palmatier family sent me a very good copy of the will along with depositions proving the will and two documents signed by the Surrogate Judge.

David Britten, Descendant of Elizabeth Drake and Jacob Devoe through their Daughter Betsey DeVoe who married Peter Britten, has a deposition which states that William Drake and Elizabeth Taylor were the parents of Josiah Drake. Notarized and dated: Dec. 19, 1889 (but, I have no other proof that this is true.) Especially since parts of the deposition are questionable as to accuracy.

I checked the Doherty book and there are three relevant listings for you:

1. on p.469 in the "Other and Unplaced Drakes" section, Doherty gives "Jesias Drake and wife Antje Jansenn had son Willem b. 26 Dec 1773 and bp. 28 Aug 1774 with Sponcers. Richard Hansenn and his wife. [NHRCh].

A Josias Drake was in Clinton in 1800 at 1-0-1-1-0 and 3-0-1-0-0 and was between Jacob I. Deane and Samuel Morey.

Sias [sic] Drake was assessed in 1801 in Clinton on \$50 personal property only and paid a tax of \$.11." I'm not sure why he links the Jesias listed here as Willem's father to the one on record in Clinton. (Michael Boyer O'Leary)

The book is Frank J. Doherty, "Settlers of the Beekman Patent, Dutchess County, NY, An Historical and Geneal. Study of all the 18th Century Settlers in the Patent." (Pleasant Valley, NY: 1997).

OTHER AND UNPLACED DRAKES

There were two other early Drakes (or Dracks) in the Fishkill area. Francis Drack was in the South Ward from Feb. 1724/25 as the miller at Madame Brett's, to 6 Sept. 1740 when Letters of Administration are granted on his estate to Adolph Philipse, Esq. A William Drack was also in Fishkill from 1737 through 1754. He was married to Elizabeth Taylor and they had several children baptized in the Fishkill Dutch Church. John Drake was executor to the estate of William Drake. [May 1764, CP].

Peter JANSEN was born in Bergen Norway and m. 12 Oct 1707 Maria, b. June or July 1687, dau of Peter and Cathine (Hoffmeyer) LOSSING. He was called Peter Janson Norman [?] at the birth of his last two children. Peter JANSEN/JOHNSON was granted 500 acres in Marlborough in 1712. He was dec'd by 1715 when Servus ffleraboom, on behalf of Johannes JOHNSON and others, children of Peter JOHNSON, dec'd, petitioned for 300 acres [See History of Town of Marlborough, p 47-8].

Peter LOSSING Jr. of the Highland rec'd First Communion 12 Oct 1707 as did his sister Maria, wife of Pieter JOHNSON. ON 17 July 1709 Peter and Maria were Sp. For Maria, the dau. Of George Springsteen and his wife Catherina in the Highlands.

Hope Hatch located Much of this information after the 1979 record was completed. She found many Drake Descendents living in Michigan that we never knew existed. (Hope is the wife of Clyde Hatch; a descendent of John Rodman Drake)

New info:

Michael Boyer O'Leary. who is trying to straighten out the several William Drake's that are listed (" In search of William Drake") which puts our William's birthplace as New Hackensack, Dutchess Co., NY and his birthdate as Dec 26, 1773. Our William is listed as WmRose. We know from Census, Steuben Co History and Michigan Census information that he had to have been born about 1773. -- But, there is also a Wm73 listed in Mr. O'Leary's work. I believe they are the same William)

Thanks to this info received Jan 5, 2000 from Michael Boyer O'Leary's work "In Search of William Drake" we now had a lead to find the info we needed to Prove both William's birthdate and also prove our info was correct on who his parents were.

I sent Hope Hatch a copy of Michael Boyer O'Leary's E-mail,

She discovered and sent me the information found in the Library in Syracuse, what she first thought was the Birth of William to Josiah and Anntje Jansen, turned out to be the Baptism of William.

That Date was Aug 28, 1774, this information was found In Col 2 New Hackensack: New Hackensack is in Dutchess Co, NY in the town of Fishkill. "The Records of the Refomed Dutch Church of New Hackensack, Dutchess Co. NY, Vol V of Collections of the Dutchess Co., Hist. Soc. ed. by Tower

William was (bp) Aug 28, 1774 son of Jesajas Drake witnessed by Richard Janssen & his wife) (The Doherty book has Richard's last name as Hanssen) This info from Hope should have been listed as baptism not birth. (This confirmed what I had received on Line from Michael O'Leary)

In the 1980's Hope found that:

William and Catherine Rose Drake were Married at the 1st Reformed Dutch Church of Poughkeepsie, Orange Co., New York on the 14th of October 1793 (one letter has the date as 1798 - it is possible that the copy is poor and what looks like a 3 & is actually an 8) Film #533-472 (I just recently found that part of Ulster county was apparently taken from Orange County.)

(I think one of these two ladies sent Hope the Xerox copy of the Wedding info for Wm & Catherine

Mrs. Merie Taylor's Husband descended from Levi Drake. (of Andrews, In.)

Janet Snyder also wrote Hope Hatch that she was a gr.gr.gr.granddaughter of C.R. Drake, thru Lucinda Drake Eldridge's line. I found something in my notes that lead me to believe that is where the copy came from)

In 1800 Census William is in New Paltz, Ulster Co., NY.

The Listing for William Drake shows he has
2 M under 5 years, The two boys under 5 would have
been Josiah and John Rodman Drake.

1 M 16-26 yrs. which is Probably William Himself.

In the book titled "Times and Tales of the Town of Lloyd"
by Beatrice Hasbrouck Wadlin, published in 1974.

References to Our family can be found.

[page 129 to 133 describe the Penn Yan Settlement (a section within the Town of Lloyd). The Penn Yan Settlement was made in the year 1800 on a wedge shaped or triangular piece of land. Penn Yan was named after a settlement of the same name in Yates County, New York (reasons why are described in the article). It is an area that doesn't exist today.

One paragraph of this article reads:

"In Sherwood, Vol III, pg 52, other names are also listed among these Pang Yang people. they are: Peter and Thomas Berean. Elizabeth, wife of Thomas Rogers was the witch. "Old Bets" Abram Parmeter and Rachel his wife. Some of the first mentioned names had several brother or sons. Later Gilbert Drake, the elder and Johnathan Tomkins arrived."

Another paragraph:

"Up on the Peat Swamp Road a William Drake lived on the Amasa Martin place in 1805....." pg 131

This information came from Dan Stifflear who has a copy of the book.

We have also included two photographs of the Drake Cemetery located on this land taken in 1999 by Beverly Jones.

Josiah Drake is also listed in this book on pg R11.

In 1808 William & Catherine are in Benton Center, Yates County, New York where they are admitted by letter into the 1st Baptist Church of Benton Center, Yates County, New York. (Source for this information - "Early Settlers of NY Book 1 Vol. 3 pg 117")

In 1809, John joins "Admitted" the First Baptist Church of Benton Center, Yates County, NY by Baptism.

By 1810 they have moved to Prattsburgh, Steuben County, NY (Ingleside was once part of Prattsburgh and known as Riker's Hollow) with Thomas Riker who must have come west with them from Ulster County. (quoting from a letter from Hope dated 2/12/1985 she states that "on the 1810 census, I found the trio, Michael Keith, Thomas Riker and Wm. Drake in Steuben Co-Bath, NY (Prattsburg had not been incorporated as a town in this Census). All living in the same area." the next paragraph she says that M.Keith was alone in Ingleside when the other two arrived."

Note:

(the 1790 Census of New Paltz we find: Josiah Drake, Thomas Riker, John Riker & John Riker Jr. in Ulster County living near to each other) from Hope Hatch

(In one letter from Hope Hatch, she says that she found William is mentioned -- "William Drake was an early settler of Prattsburgh Township, Steuben Co., NY")

I found this February 2008 -- this confirmed the info from Hope Hatch

CHAPTER VII

The West Hill settlement was commenced in 1805, by Stephen Prentiss, Warham Parsons, and Aaron Cook. The Settlement of Riker's Hollow was commenced in 1807, by Michael Keith, who joined in 1810, by Thomas Riker, John Riker, and William Drake.

In 1830 Josiah, William's son would have been 33, so it is possible that your Wayne Co, Palmyra could be this Josiah. but giving the 60 yr old Carp Josiah Drake was probably his father, living in Palmyra, I would guess this is not the one we are looking for.

From what we know about Gilbert's Josiah, your info for Josiah of Kent Co. Gaines Mich. is most likely Gilbert's son also known as Josiak in our family History. As that was how his name was spelled when his Deposition was written. His Death Certificate is spelled Josiah and Gilbert is listed as his Father.

The Josiah born in Ulster Co, living in Rochester is to young age 20.

It is possible if he served in the military & that he died???, or Decided he liked where ever he was and stayed there. Or another possibility made the Military a career.??

The location of our Josiah son of William is still in question.

It wasn't until the End of October 1999 that we finally had any information on their daughter, Polly. We still don't have a birthdate for her. It was given to us by Beverly Jones of Endicott, NY. , who is also descendant of Gilbert.

We knew they had four sons (#5 is a daughter that Hope had found listed in Census Records, but We could not locate a name for her or where she might have lived until Beverly shared her ggrandfathers deposition with us. (I sort of thought this girl might have been a daughter-in-law, but, Josiah's depo. proved Hope correct again.)

After 1830 Census:

William and Catherine part with their Son, John Rodman Drake.

William and Catherine removed to Michigan and are found in 1832. They first settled in Washtenaw County and lived there for a short time before coming to Bengal, Clinton County, MI. Where they are listed as the second settlers in the town.

(Mrs. Merie Taylor's Husband descended from Levi Drake. (of Andrews, In.)

Janet Snyder also wrote Hope Hatch that she was a gr.gr.gr.granddaughter of C.R. Drake, thru Lucinda Drake Eldridge's line.

(In a letter dated Feb 14, 1988, she stated that she had found)

"In Clinton County History" that:

"In the fall 1838 The second family moved into the Township of Bengal, Clinton County, Michigan. They were William Drake and wife, with their three sons, two married and one single. Cornelius R. Drake, Uriah Drake, and Levi Drake. They settled on the East half of North West and

Southwest quarter of Section 30 which was divided among the sons: C.R. taking the south part (55 acres)

Uriah the middle part (50 acres) and

Levi the North (55 acres). This history also states that "The widows of C.R. and Uriah are still living on their homeland ",

Levi moved into Dallas Township where he still lives.

I had received The Info Re: William's birth from Michael Boyer O'Leary which he had located in the Doherty Book: NOTE: (The Doherty book has Richard's last name as Hanssen) The Library's records spelled the last name as Janssen (possibly a relative of Antje), I hate to say it, but I would think what Hope copied was the Correct spelling especially in light of the Marriage record she included.

This is what is posted on Michael Boyer O'Leary's site the last time I checked:

William (sometimes recorded as "Willem"), b. 26 Dec 1773 to Jesayas and Antje (Janssen) Drake in Hackensack, bapt. Aug 28, 1774, md. 14 Oct 1793 (or 1798), 1st Reformed Dutch Church of Poughkeepsie, Orange, NY, to Catherine Rose, d/o John and Catherine Rose of Ulster County NY. Found in Benton Center Yates Co., NY transferred by letter to the Benton Center Baptist Church in about 1808 (Early Settlers of NY book 1 V3 pg 117). They also were in Rikers Hollow which is now called Ingleside near Prattsburg NY Abt 1810.

I checked the Doherty book and there are three relevant listings for you:

1. on p.469 in the "Other and Unplaced Drakes" section, Doherty gives "Jesias Drake and wife Antje Jansenn had son Willem b. 26 Dec 1773 and bp. 28 Aug 1774 with Sp. Richard Hansenn and his wife. [NHRCh]. A Josias Drake was in Clinton in 1800 at 1-0-1-1-0 and 3-0-1-0-0 and was between Jacob I. Deane and Samuel Morey. Sias [sic] Drake was assessed in 1801 in Clinton on \$50 personal property only and paid a tax of \$.11." I'm not sure why he links the Jesias listed here as Willem's father to the one on record in Clinton.

2. on p.471 in the "Other and Unplaced Drakes" section, Doherty gives "William Drake and Catherine Rose had son Josiah, b. 8 Oct 1797, bp. 14 Jan 1798. [PRCh]" Unfortunately, I don't have the page where he explains the PRCh abbreviation. Can look on my next NEHGS trip, or perhaps it's a familiar abbrev for you. Maybe Poughkeepsie Reformed Church?

3. on p.469 in the "Other and Unplaced Drakes" section, Doherty gives: "Josiah Drake was born 1 July 1750 at Fishkill but lived in New Paltz when he enlisted.

He applied for his pension 19 April 1833 when living at the latter place. No family was noted in his application. [Rev Pens S10587]."

Given 1 and 2, it looks like we're dealing with two distinct Josiah's, and it also looks like we should find out what PRCh was so that you can confidently add the Josiah in #2 to your list of kids for Wm and Catherine.

Catherine was the daughter of John & Catherine Rose of Ulster Co., NY - through the will of John Rose. The family was out of New Jersey. Catherine had a brother Jacob. She also had a nephew, Aaron who went West to Oregon and for whom the town of Roseburgh Oregon is named. (from the Rose Family Association--Christine Rose, CG, CGL, FASG)

Catharine was listed as the wife of Wm. Drake and was left \$10 dollars in her father's will to buy mourning with.

Oddly, there is no mention of Catherine anywhere in all of Clinton Co, that I have been able to find. I had thought it very likely that William's wife was a woman named Hannah as she is the oldest Drake I could find. Maybe you know who she is. Hannah Drake is buried in the Elsie Village Cemetery in Elsie. She was born 1789 and died 1864. I managed to find her on the 1860 census in Duplain Twp. living with Sylvester and Maria Carter. Notes for JACOB PALMATIER:

Barb, I have done quite a bit of reseach in Ulster County records and the file I'm sending with this msg is for that of the only Jacob Palmatier I have found in Ulster County. I may have sent this file to you some time back.

He would have been of the right age to have married for the 2nd time sometime after about 1822 a woman born in the 1780's or 1790's, namely Sarah/Sally Drake.

After executing the 1837 deed, Jacob disappears from Ulster County records.

I can't believe he would have left Ulster County for MI or some other State and left a couple of young daughters behind. I would think if he went anywheres, it would have been to MI or to Steuben County. Where is Courtland, MI? Could work that angle, to see what Palmatier/Palmateers were there in the mid-1800's. I can't find such a place in MI.

By the same token, he would have been around 50 years of age in 1837 and he could have died between then and the taking of the 1840 census.

!Jacob Palmatier, parentage not known as of April 2000, was born between 1780 and 1790 (based upon census age in 1830).

! In a review of "The Palmatier Families of New York State", by Howard A. McConville, 1975, and the "Palmatier-Parmentier Family of Dutchess County, NY", by Prentiss Glazier, 1976, the only known Jacob Palmatier to have been born between 1780 and 1790 was the son of John I. Palmatier and Maria/Mary "Jury/Yerry".

! McConville's manuscript states (under #73/180) that "Jacobus" was baptised 2 December 1781 at Poughkeepsie, NY; married in 1817; probably had a son named Jacob E. born in 1818; "and went to Michigan, where he lived in Courtland.

! (Note: There is a Courtland Township in Kent County, MI, near

Rockford, MI.)

! Glazier's manuscript (on page 13), in listing the children of John I. Palmatier, states "Jacobus, b. 2 Dec. 1781, bp. P.; "went to Courtland, Michigan".

! NOTE: As of April 2000, the information shown below does not appear to be that of the Jacob who went to Michigan.

!A Jacob Palmatier married Catherine _____ (death certificate of daughter Catherine).

! Based upon the 1820 census age of his wife, it appears she was born prior to 1794. Based upon her age in the 1830 census, it suggests she was born between 1790 and 1799. If the woman in both censuses was the same woman, then she was probably born between 1790 and 1793.

!In the 1820 US census, Jacob was enumerated in the Town of New Paltz, Ulster County, New York. His census entry is on page 071, the same page as that of a Peter Palmatier. Jacob's family size consisted of the following:

! The Peter Palmatier of 1820 was aged 26-45.

about 1770 in New Paltz, Ulster County. They were the parents of 7 children, all born between 1773 and 1787.

Barbary "Parmentier" and James Simpson, both of New Paltz, were married 15 February 1840 at Dashville (Ulster County) ("Marriage Notices, Dutchess County, NY Newspapers, 1826-1851", by Kinship, 1983, page 249). A child, Sarah Catherine, born 20 August 1841, was baptised as an adult 21 February 1862 at the New Paltz Reformed Dutch Church ("Records of the New Paltz Reformed Dutch Church", by Jean D. Worden, 1986).

! Barbary and James were enumerated in the 1850 US census in the Town of Lloyd, Ulster County, NY. Their census entry is on page 290, the census was taken 23 August and it was stated that all members had been born in New York:

! Jeremiah "Palmateer" died in Lloyd, Ulster County, NY 31 May 1890. As of April 2000 he had not been found in any censuses. Jeremiah has 5 deeds recorded in Ulster County Deed Books: 1 in 1884, 2 in 1888 and 2 in 1889. Upon his death, a Letter of Administration was issued to Eliza "Palmateer". It is possible this Eliza was Jeremiah's sister. In Ulster County Deed Book 300, page 597, is a deed dated 10 September 1891 by Jacob Palmatier of the City of Chicago, Illinois, in which is stated that Jacob was the only child and next of kin of Jeremiah Palmatier, deceased. Jeremiah's death certificate, on file with the Town Clerk of Lloyd, lists his age as 67 years and the fact he had been born in Ulster County. His death certificate does not list his parents names.
